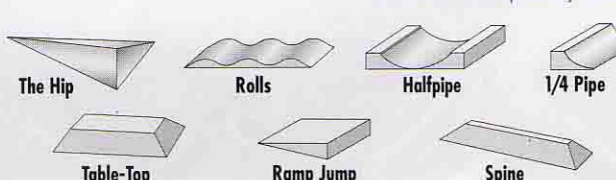

Snowshed Crossover
This trail will be closed Saturdays, Sundays and holidays to reduce cross-trail traffic. To reach Snowshed Area when Snowshed Crossover is closed, ski/snowboard Great Eastern to Northbrook Crossover. Then ride the Northbrook Quad to Snowshed and Killington Base Areas.

Freestyle Terrain Responsibility
Freestyle terrain use, like all skiing and riding, exposes you to the risk of serious injury. Prior to using freestyle terrain, it is your responsibility to familiarize yourself with all instructions and warnings, and follow Your Responsibility Code.

Great Eastern / Great Northern
These trails represent easier routes from the top of Killington Peak, winding through many of Killington's mountains. You may choose to end your run down these trails at either the Skyeship Base Station, Snowdon, Killington, Rams Head, Snowshed or Bear Mountain areas.



PIPES AND PARKS. Above are just a few of the elements featured in our parks. Please use caution. Elements may change due to weather and use. Variations exist. Our terrain parks are located at "The Beach" on Snowshed, Timberline at Rams Head and Triple Slope at Pico. Another park is located on Upper East Glade early season and periodically throughout the regular season. The halfpipe is located at the bottom of the Highline trail just outside Killington Base Lodge.

The trail marking symbols (green circle, blue square, black diamond and double-black diamond) indicate only the relative degree of challenge on a particular slope or trail compared with other slopes or trails at Killington. Use of the same symbol classification at another ski area does not indicate degree of difficulty of trails at Killington. Be aware, also, that gradients and difficulty vary within each trail. Snow conditions, visibility and the number of skiers and snowboarders can all make trails more challenging.

It is a good idea to start off on the "Easier" trails when skiing an area for the first time; then, if you wish, progress to the "More Difficult" and "Most Difficult" as you get a feel for the area's general degree of difficulty.

FUSION ZONES
Fusion Zones (tree skiing, trails and snowboarding areas) are not maintained or checked by ski area personnel. Unmarked obstacles and other natural hazards exist throughout. Stay within the defined tree skiing/snowboarding area. Consult your Trail Guide. Do not ski/ride alone, but preferably in groups of three or more. Be aware. Use good judgment and ski/ride accordingly.

LIFT AND TRAIL HOURS
Key lifts open 8 a.m. weekends/holidays and at 9 a.m. weekdays, with other lifts opening at varying times. All lifts close by 4 p.m.

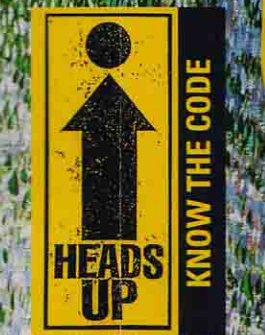

Your Responsibility Code
Skiing and snowboarding can be enjoyed in many ways. At ski areas you may see people using Alpine, snowboard, telemark, cross-country or other specialized ski equipment, such as that used by disabled or other skiers. Regardless of how you decide to enjoy the slopes or our tree skiing areas, always show courtesy to others and be aware that there are elements of risk in the sport that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Observe the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a great outdoor experience.

1. Always stay in control and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way; it is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
4. Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
5. Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
7. Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load.
